NIADDK ANIMALS AVAILABLE TO QUALIFIED INVESTIGATORS

The Diabetes Program of the National Institute of Arthritis, Diabetes, and Digestive and Kidney Diseases wishes to announce the availability of a limited number of BioBreeding/Worcester (BB/W) rats being produced under a contract supported by the Institute. The animals include spontaneously diabetic rats and diabetic-prone weanlings as well as diabetes-resistant BB/W controls.

The animals were derived from the original col-

ony developed by the BioBreeding Laboratories of Ottawa, Canada, and are in the 17-18th generation of repeated brother-sister matings.

Animals will be supplied, for the most part, to NIH grantees only, and will be distributed free of charge according to guidelines provided by an advisory committee. Characteristics of the model and health surveillance information will be supplied.

Animals will be shipped in containers designed to maximize the well-being of the animals and transit time shall be less than 24 hours whenever possible. Shipping charges shall be borne by the recipients.
